

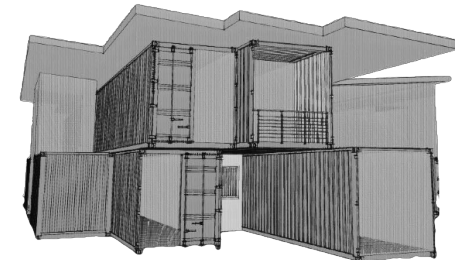
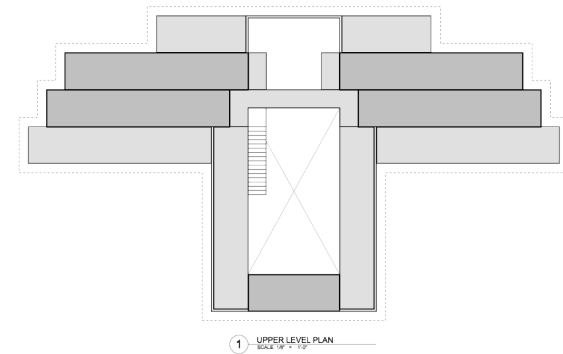
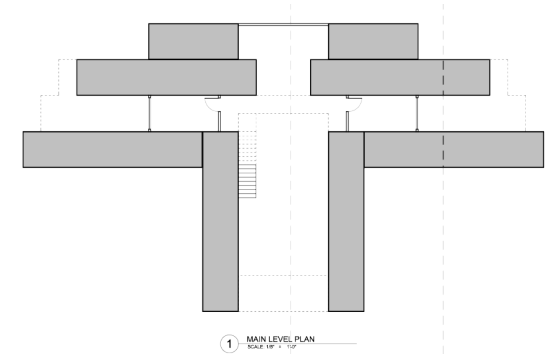
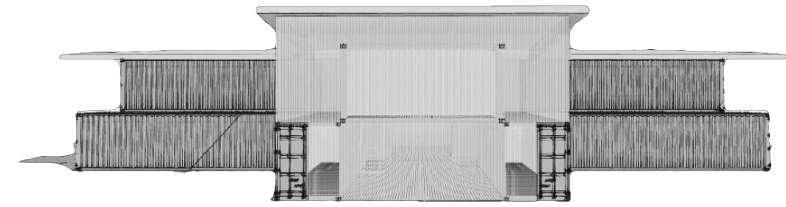
Project: Huisken Hall

Investment: \$295K

Description: state of the art Multipurpose Facility

Intended long term use will be to house faculty and students. Providing lodging and logistics to groups from Hope College will provide operating revenue for village operations as well as providing ncv with other technical resources.

Needed Time: Construction of the facility will take approximately 5 months. The ground breaking" will take place upon receiving 50% of the total required funds... This is amount needed to complete the facility to the point at which it can be used for daily activities (I.e. classes, gatherings, etc.)



Sustainable Investment

College students expect to pay for tuition, room and board, and logistics as part of their study abroad expenses. As an on-site dormitory, Huisken Hall will enable students to live and learn in a comfortable setting while providing a constant source of revenue for the orphanage--a key component of NCV's long-term sustainability.

Shipping Containers

The buildings structure will be comprised of 8 X40' High-Cubes and 2x20' High Cubes. Current imports exceed exports and high fuel prices have created a surplus of containers in Rwanda. We are able to purchase them for under \$2,400 a piece - delivery included.

Using these "building blocks" will also decrease the amount of time needed to complete the facility. We'll only need to rent heavy machinery for one day, once the foundation is laid and the containers delivered.

State of the Art

Our vision is to develop a multi-purpose facility which can be serve as both a residence and center of learning for Hope students, faculty, and other visitors to the orphanage.

Fulfilling our vision entails providing sufficient housing--sleeping quarters, modern bathrooms, access to clean water and electricity--and resources for academic work such as a classroom space and wireless internet.

Timeframe

Our goal is have Huisken Hall fully operational by May 2013. Financial projections regarding the viability of this initiative have been included on back of this page.

Why "Huisken" Hall

The facility is named in honor of Hope's beloved registrar, John Huisken. In addition to serving as a mentor for thousands of Hope students over the course of his distinguished career, Huisken provided invaluable guidance to the project during its early stages.

Supply

We've included the total costs estimated to bring Huisken Hall from vision to fruition. This facility will be the single, largest investment, but a critical component of this village. Yet, its addition, is key to the sustainability of the project. Upon completion, the village will serve orphan children whose very lives depend on the success of the sustainability initiatives. But in serving the children, the villages will also serve as a center of global learning for Rwandans as well as for international students and visitors. It will become a hands-on laboratory connecting it to higher education.

Demand

Hope College is a learning community. As such, students and faculty model an aspiration for experiential education in which the world becomes the classroom. The College's goal supports our belief that we will find faculty to lead and students to take courses in Rwanda.
